IT AGAIN

McKinley Determined to Revive Arbitration Treaty.

S PROFITING BY EXPERIENCE

New Treaty Has Airendy Been Drafted to Serve as a Basis of Negotiations.

Washington, June 19.-President McKinley has determined to revive the arbitration treaty between the United States and Great Britain. He has already turned his attention to the subject, and under the direction of Secmary Sherman, the matter has progressed to the extent that a new treaty has already been drafted to serve as the basis of negotiations. In the draft which is to be used as the basis there are said to be none of the objectionable points treaty. It is not in contemplation that the treaty will be submitted to the senate before next December, and there is reason to believe that the attitude of the senate toward a new treaty will be fully canvassed and understood before the treaty is signed.

It is understood that the initiative in the present case will be taken by the government, as the failure of the former reaty, by the inaction of the senate, left the subject in such a condition that the British government did not feel disposed to renew negotiations until first invited by the United States.






