Weekly Commercial Review.

Whenever we observe anything of moment which is important to record in the markets we propose to make a note of it, for the benefit of our readers, and shall give as complete reports as any of our contemporaries, if not so long. When we consider the real value, not estimated worth, of Oregon products; remember her fertile soil, and manifold resources of every nature—then realize the destruction of mills and machinery in the United States during the late fearful war, we can see only a brilliant future for our State. This valley as extensive as England herself, Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Ohio and Pennsylvania are big States, they cast an immense Electoral Vote, to say nothing of the popular vote, but what are they all compared with Oregon? Only populated. They have no such climate; no mineral to compare with ours; no grain such as we produce; and as for wool—they are sending out to Oregon, we understand, to get a taste of what we have in that line as we have been feeding them on Oregon flour. The prospects for higher prices on grain are for a very doubtful nature. Wool next year will command good round prices, for the reason that local consumption at the West is increasing every year, and the mills throughout the country never rely almost exclusively on the domestic article. In the New England States there is more machinery now in operation than for some years; the large importations of foreign wool and woolsens attracted to the country by the judicious changes of the tariff some time ago, have been resumed; and the Government has sold out the surplus grains on hand at the close of the war, and American manufacturers have almost a clear field. The influence of our highly protective tariff must be felt the ensuing year, and prices of American wool must come up to near the cost of importing similar grades of foreign production.

On the 6th, wheat was selling at \$1.75 per bushel; \$1.80 in San Francisco. Flour \$3.50 per barrel; \$3.60 for extra. California Oats \$1.90; Oregon Oats \$1.85.
