

LEGISLATIVE NOTES.

The "Forty Days" nearly up, and the Session and People Equally Pleas'd. Williamson's bill, which makes it unlawful to drive sheep from one county to another to pasture on the public domain, passed the House Friday by a large vote. Dimick's bill to define the duties of the fish commissioners was called up Friday by Representative Kirk and passed by a vote of 27 to 23. It also passed the Senate. The bill to divide Wasco county, the new county to be called Fulton, passed the House Friday, with the amendment that the name of the new county should be Sherman instead of Fulton. It transpired that Fulton was the name of an old time Democrat, and it would never do for a Republican legislature to so honor him. Senator Dawson's bill, providing for an appropriation of \$20,000 to build a deaf mute school within two and a half miles of Albany, failed to pass the Senate. The bill to divide Union county will not pass. The Senate has refused to take it up under suspension of the rules. The following bills were passed by the Senate Friday: By Cauthorn—Amending the Corvallis charter. By Roe—Amending the La Grande charter. By Bean—Amending the Pendleton charter. By Howard—Amending the charter of Grant's Pass. By Foster—Amending the Albina charter. By Condon—Amending the Eugene City charter. By Moss—Incorporating Lakeview. By Price—Incorporating Central Point. By Watts—Amending the Dayton charter. By Mackay—A resolution that either the superintendent or warden of the penitentiary be required to reside in the prison. Haskell's bill, to build a wagon road from Huntington to Connor creek, failed to pass the House. The assessment and taxation bill passed the House Friday. Both houses of the Legislature adjourned Saturday at noon until Monday at one o'clock. The bill requiring sheriffs to settle with county treasurers every thirty days has passed the third reading in the Senate.

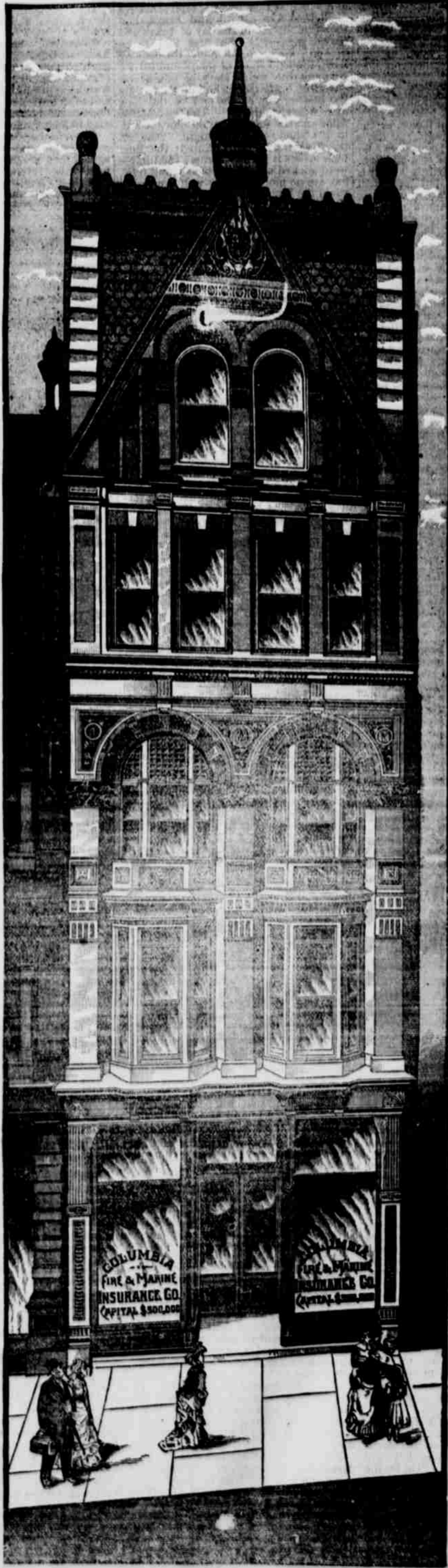
