THE COUNTY COURT

LITTLE IMPORTANT BUSINESS HAS BEEN TRANSACTED.

Court is Looking Over Route of Mellman-Remo Road Today—Long List of Bills Viewed and Allowed.

Little business of importance has been transacted by the county court since convening last Wednesday. The bonds of all the new county officers were approved and filed and several minor road matters settled, but most of the time has been taken up in viewing and allowing bills.

The court, consisting of Judge Hartman and Commissioners Walker and Gilliland, left this morning for Milton where they were to join H. Mellman, the promoter of the proposed electric railroad from here to Dayton. There they will be furnished with a team and rig and will drive down to the county line, and drive back to Pendleton this afternoon, viewing the line where the proposed road is to build. This is being done in order that the county officials may get an idea of where the road is to run, this will help them in making their contract with the promoters. Action will be taken on the matter of a franchise.
