## SEVENTY YEARS OLD EPWORTH LEAGUE

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF GREAT REPUBLICAN BOSS.

Last Dictator in a Line of Political Autocrats of Whom Thurlow Weed Was the First—Has Held But Four Offices During His Lifetime.

New York, July 15.—This is Senator Platt's birthday. He was born in Owego, Tioga county, a little town on the Erie railway, which he still claims as his residence, on the 15th of July, 1833, hence he is 70 years old. A few of his intimate friends assisted him to celebrate the event this afternoon and evening at the Oriental Hotel, Manhattan Beach, which place he has made his summer residence for many years.

Although Mr. Platt has grown old rapidly during the last few years, and during the Philadelphia convention was so ill that it was feared he would not recover, he has to a large degree recovered his strength, and is still vigorous enough to control the republican organization without question.

The span of Senator Platt's life cannot be measured by years. He has known intimately, socially and politically, Presidents Abraham Lincoln, Andrew Johnson, Ulysses S. Grant, Chester A. Arthur, Benjamin Harrison, William McKinley, and Theodore Roosevelt. He has had a strenuous share in shaping the political careers of some of them. All the republican governors of New York state, from Edwin D. Morgan in 1858, have been his friends, and some were politically created by him.

### As a Pie Counter Autocrat.

Vice-presidents, United States senators, lieutenant governors, congressmen, state legislators, collectors of the port of New York and other federal officers of the state, judges of the court of appeals, sheriffs, county clerks and county judges, and all sorts and conditions of republican placeholders have owed their election to Mr. Platt. For 20 years Thurlow Weed shaped the course of the whig and republican parties in the state of New York. He was succeeded in a direct line by William H. Seward, Reuben E. Fenton and Roscoe Conkling. Mr. Platt was the direct political heir of Mr. Conkling.

Senator Platt has held but four public offices. In 1858 he was elected clerk of Tioga county and filled the place for three years. In 1872 he was elected to the Forty-third congress. In 1874 he was re-elected to the Forty-fourth congress, and in 1876 he declined a third nomination. In 1880 he was appointed a special commissioner for New York harbor, and in 1897 he was elected United States senator to succeed Mr. Hill, who has been his political rival for many years. This year he was re-elected to the senate without opposition in the ranks of his own party.

JUNIOR METHODISTS MEET TOMORROW IN CONVENTION.

Gathering Will Comprise Thousands of Delegates From All Over the Civilized World—Remarkable Record of Notables Attending.

Detroit, Mich., July 15.—The sixth international convention of the Epworth League opens auspiciously here tomorrow. What the Christian Endeavor is to the other evangelical denominations, such is the Epworth League to the great world of the direct followers of John Wesley and his teachings. Strong efforts have been made at different times to induce the Methodists to come within the fold of the Christian Endeavor, but the governing spirits of the denomination, reinforced in a large measure by the rank and file, have preferred to maintain and develop their own organization for young people. To this end they have labored with unabated zeal and energy, with the result that numerical strength and in spiritual influence, the Epworth League of Methodists is now second only to the church proper itself.

Thanks in a measure to the central location of Detroit and its superb transportation facilities, the arrivals to date and the advices concerning organized delegations and individual visitors who are en route, indicate that the convention will be the largest ever held under the auspices of the body. Canada undoubtedly will be better represented than at any convention held since that in Toronto six years ago.

### Many Notables Attending.

The present gathering will be notable for the number of distinguished people who are to take active part in the proceedings. These include Governor Bliss, of Michigan; Bishop E. K. Rosa, Bishop Williams of the colored M. E. church; Rev. C. E. Hamilton, D. D., of Rochester, N. Y.; Rev. L. H. Murlin, D. D., of Kansas; President J. W. Bashford, of Ohio Wesleyan University; Rev. A. C. Galloway, Rev. J. H. Riddell, D. D., of Winnipeg; Miss Mary M. Dennis, of Richmond, Ind.; John C. Woolley, of Chicago; President John Mitchell, of the United Mineworkers; Bishop Dean W. Joyce, Rev. E. M. Mills, D. D., of Elmira, N. Y., and Rev. A. C. Crews, general secretary of the Canadian Epworth League.

The great gathering will be formally opened tomorrow afternoon with three simultaneous meetings. The meeting places will be Tent Ontario, located at the corner of Fourth, Avenue and Howard street; the Detroit opera house, and the Central M. E. church. Besides these three places where the general sessions are to be held all of the Methodist churches of the city have been pressed into service for smaller conferences and for headquarters of the various state and provincial delegations. The headquarters today presented busy scenes as the arriving delegates trooped in, registered and were given their badges. The registers showed that every state in the Union will be well represented, California, Oregon and the other states of the Pacific coast have sent unusually large delegations, considering their distant location, while the states of the Middle West count their delegates by the hundreds. New England, New York and Pennsylvania are also much in evidence, with the south is represented by some of the most prominent and active workers of the Methodist church.
