A special meeting of the Commer-cial Association will be held at 8 o'clock tomorrow evening for purpose of presenting the matter in the proper form to the citizens of Pendleton. A special invitation is extended to all to attend this meeting, and take active part in discussion of the subject

Dr. LeRoy will address the meeting and will review the extent work already done in the state. He will be glad to receive any exhibits that may be ready for delivery, and is out on an active campaign for results.

While Dr. LeRoy has been in the field but a short time, be has already secured excellent exhibits from Lane. Jackson. 


