While the best offerings available did not reach above \$7.10, while \$7.25 was received in a limited way yesterday for quality, the price paid today was in fact a dime better than would have been available for the same stuff yesterday.

There was only a small run of cattle for the day, totals being 137 head compared with 60 head last Friday, 40 a year ago and 21 head on this same day two years ago.

STUDENTS RESENT WOMEN'S ACTIONS

Glasgow, Dec. 7.—Hundreds of organized students of Glasgow university went to the headquarters of the Woman's Social and Political union and completely wrecked the offices.

The attack was the outcome of suffragette interruptions at the installation of Augustine Byrell, chief secretary for Ireland, as lord rector of Glasgow university.

Wild scenes followed the wrecking operations, finally culminating in a street riot, which was subdued only by the police. After smashing in the front windows of the women's headquarters with stones, the students rushed in, disregarding the cries of "Cowards!" from the three women left in charge of the place. They demolished the interior and destroyed everything they could lay their hands upon.
