MORGENTHAU TO HEAD MISSION TO PALESTINE

This move is the first step, it is believed, in American recognition of Palestine as a separate republic, with Jerusalem as the capital, as soon as the British take the Holy City.

TWO TOWNS SHIRT SMALLPOX BLAME

Canadian Municipalities Accuse Each Other, Then Detroit.

TILLSONBURG, Ont., July 7.—An interesting case is now on between the municipalities of St. Thomas and Tillsonburg. Elmer Heath, of Tillsonburg, went from Detroit to St. Thomas to visit a sister, where he was taken sick and treated for typhoid fever.

When discharged from the hospital he stayed at the home of his sister in St. Thomas for a few days, then came to Tillsonburg, where he was again taken sick; the local doctors pronouncing the disease smallpox. He had been among the citizens considerably, and soon several cases of the disease appeared in the large factories. All employees were vaccinated, so serious did the outbreak become.

Later, a case of smallpox was discovered in St. Thomas and the officials there asserted it came from Tillsonburg.

The Tillsonburg town clerk has notified the city of St. Thomas as a corporation it will be held responsible for the outbreak of smallpox here. Now, it is alleged, the original case came from Detroit.

500 SOLDIERS GUARD ELECTION IN IRELAND

LONDON, July 6.—That Central News correspondent at Ennis, County Clare, Ireland, says 500 infantrymen with machine guns, have arrived for duty during the Clare election. Count Plunkett arrived today. Excitement was caused by the discovery that a wreath placed on the McConnell monument had been removed by Sinn Feiners and the republican colors substituted for it.

IRON CROSSES FOR PRISONERS.

Kaiser Decides to Reward All Who Prove Bravery.

LONDON, July 7.—Emperor William, according to an Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Amsterdam has decided that all German men who have been made prisoners of war will receive the Iron cross on their return home after the war if they can prove they did not surrender voluntarily.

DON'T OVERLOOK U. S. IN WAR; SAYS FRANKFURTER ZEITUNG

Critic Says Help Will Reach Allies by Degrees; Expects No Big Offensive Until 1918.

ZURICH, July 6.—Referring to the arrival of American troops on French soil, the military critic of the Frankfurter Zeitung says that Germany must not overlook the fact that America's help is really very great, though it will come only by degrees. Under these conditions, he says, if France is obliged to restrict her military activities it will signify no strengthening of the German situation.

The critic thinks that entente plans for a greater offensive will be delayed and perhaps will not be carried out until the spring of 1918. Hence, he writes, there is greater opportunity for the central powers to take the initiative.

The critic of the Hamburger Nachrichten questions whether the entente will delay an offensive until the Americans arrive in France.

CHICAGO PREDICTS \$1 "SPUDS," ONIONS DROF

CHICAGO, July 6.—Potatoes at the good old fashioned price of \$1 are predicted for the near future in South Water street. Wholesale prices were off 40 cents a bushel today. Onions, which sold at 15 and even 20 cents a pound last winter, were quoted at 2 1/2 cents wholesale today. Cabbages were correspondingly lower.

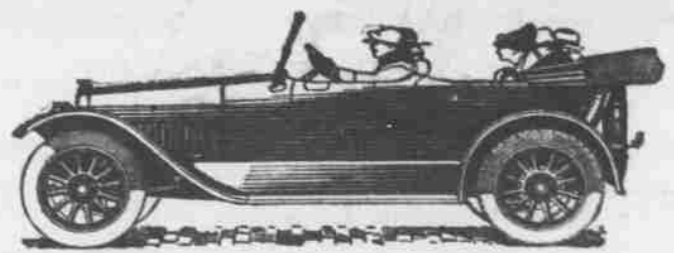
