"TOO FAR FROM THE BOWERY"

N THE newspaper parlance of New York city a news event which, though a good "story" by itself; originated in the 'provinces," is "too far from the Bowery" to warrant much space in the metropolitan dailies.

So it is with the story of the British labor crisis. We are apt to count it dry reading, to pass it by as only "another strike in England," as "too far from the Bowery." The news of these events may seem remote, dry reading, "too far from the Bowery," but it is tremendously significant.


