for the troops stationed at Fort Dalles, Oregon, for the fiscal year commencing with the return of the contract approved by the Department Commander, and ending June 30th, 1886.

Said Fresh Beef to be of good and marketable quality to be equal proportions of fore and hind quarter, (locks, shanks and kidney tallow to be excluded) and in such quantities as may be from time to time required, and on such days as shall be designated by the Commanding Officer.

The necks of the cattle slaughtered shall be cut off at the fourth vertebral joint. The shanks of the fore quarters shall be cut off from three to four inches above the knee joint, and the hind quarters from six to eight inches above the gambrel joint.

Each bid required to be accompanied by a bond (with at least two securities) in the sum of two thousand dollars for the faithful performance of the proposals contained in the bids, in case the bid is accepted.

No bids will be entertained without both principal and sureties can give undoubted proof of their loyalty to the Government of the United States of America.
