MIDDLE BOISE MINES.

A correspondent of the Statesman furnishes a sketch of the Middle Boise Mining District, which we reproduce:

MIDDLE BOISE OR YUBA DISTRICT.

Starting from Rocky Bar one morning in company with two gentlemen, one of whom was a quartz operator from New York, I found myself, after a pleasant ride over a rather rough country, on top of the "Atlanta Hill," a rather notable spot in the Middle Fork District. It is called sixteen to eighteen miles from Rocky Bar to that place, and the trail is over mountains and along ridges, of course. I think the severest part of the whole route is climbing the "Atlanta Hill," which is a tremendous mountain before one is half way up it, and increases in magnitude for some time after. Yuba City is a small log settlement lying on Yuba Creek at the foot of Atlanta Hill. A few miners are at work on the creek, with poor success, but a couple of miles below, about one hundred men are at work on Middle Boise river, and doing very well. Alturas City is another log settlement, boasting of a store, is situated on the Middle Boise at that point. Once upon the Atlanta Hill, quite a number of ledges are visible, cropping out in different parts of the hill, a great part of which is heavily timbered or covered with brush. The hill is cut into by gulches, which have, some of them, been found rich in gold and have been worked to advantage the present season.

A LOOK AT QUARTZ.

The ledges in the immediate vicinity of Rocky Bar are found to contain gold, with perhaps an occasional trace of silver, but only two miles from there, easterly, good silver as well as good ore, is found in the Vanderbilt, California, Mariposa and Saragosa ledges. Following the same range of quartz east, we find gold and silver ledges again on the top of a high mountain called "Gold Hill," though they are but little worked. Still eastward again, in fact about east of north-east, is the Yuba District, as commonly known, though its real title in deeds and papers is Middle Boise District. Here are found very rich ledges of quite large size, not only upon the Atlanta Hill but upon others. I confined my examination chiefly to the Atlanta Hill, as the ledges there sufficed to satisfy me of the richness of the district. I have traveled through the different mining camps of Southern Idaho the present season and which I have taken pains to see, and personally examine the prominent ledges everywhere. Nowhere else have I seen ledges that so uniformly combined size with richness as here. The ore is, some of it, very rich in silver as well as gold, and in every ledge I visited, I saw indications that silver would predominate. The most prominent ledge in Yuba, as well as the most developed, is the "Atlanta," which is fast becoming an object of prominence in that part of the country. Portions of the ledge show the richest quality of silver ore, while gold is visible to the naked eye. I take the Atlanta as the type of the District, as it is the principal ledge there, and has been traced for one mile and a half, after showing croppings thirty to forty feet wide. I should consider it inside the mark to say the ledge was fifteen to twenty feet in width, and in each place where it has been developed it promises to pay largely. I shall leave time to tell its story without attempting to say how rich Yuba District may be, and I am confident that in time its ledges will take a first rank in the market, and if the Comstock ledge has any competition or equal in Idaho, I am inclined to believe that the Atlanta will, all things considered, have to step in and compete. There is a prospect that New York capital will come, in another year, to assist in developing that section of the country, as several gentlemen have lately been there, who are either the representatives of capital, or else have an idea of going east with quartz to dispose of. It is favorable to the interest of Yuba that all who visit it are confident of its richness in ores, and are rather anxious to secure ground there to dispose of it. Although opened in several places the Atlanta has not been sunk on to sufficient depth to reveal its width to advantage, but every blow struck upon it shows continued improvement.

HOW TO GET THERE.

I am more particular in describing Yuba as I saw it, from the reason that I was much surprised to find such favorable prospects in a country so little known and appreciated, beside which I feel a natural pride in Idaho that induces me to rejoice in its coming fair prospects. Having traveled from Boise City by the old emigrant route and across Prairie thither, and returned from Rocky Bar by way of the Basin, I am prepared to ask why is not some step taken to secure the nearest and best route, and work it? At present one goes half around Rocky Bar before reaching there, and no doubt travel half as far again as is necessary, and that, too, in each instance by roads that my quill has no capacity to tell of. South Boise alone has a right to demand improvement, but with the extending of the rich quartz belt eastward, comes the question, Who shall make the road? I am assured by those who know that this belt

of quartz can be traced forty miles east of north-east, the course of the ledges from Rocky Bar, which induces me to prophesy that though a very rough spot of earth, Alturas county will soon command a prominent place in mining.
