THE EFFECT OF WAR UPON PUBLIC MORALS. All historians concur in stating that after great wars, especially those of an internecine character, when the mad passions of human nature become more than usually excited and aroused, crime invariably exhibits an increase, and atrocious acts are both more numerous and more flagrant in character. War stirs up all the worst feelings of the human heart, encourages license and destroys the moral sensibility. In a civil war, brother becomes arrayed against brother, father against son, and the instincts of nature are perverted from their natural action. The Furies become the favorite goddesses, and pandemonium is translated to earth. The life of the camp, where the beneficial influence of mother, wife and sister, and of home discipline are unfeeling, is most pernicious to morals, and as all armies are usually composed of the youth of the land, the fountain is poisoned at the very head. The old officers of the revolution were accustomed to deplore the effects of military life upon their subordinates, the vices of gaming, blasphemy and general debauchery, having as they saw, made rapid strides amongst men who, when engaged in the peaceful pursuits of husbandry, commerce or mechanical employments had been useful and exemplary citizens. It is not our purpose here to intimate that the man of the camp is necessarily likely to prove the worst member of society; on the contrary, where he has been subjected to proper discipline, he may be improved, but it is the general effect of war in exciting bad emotions to which we refer. Those who remain at home are placed under the influence of the same feelings, and become more or less affected. From all sides we hear of the commission of enormous crimes, of increasing lawlessness, of contempt for the restraints of law, with the disgusting and sickening details of which our exchanges from every quarter are laden. Society must, and of course will, right itself in this matter, but the steps to be taken by our civil guardians cannot be too soon adopted. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, and it is rather useless to lock the stable door after the horse has been stolen. The obvious duties of the custodians of the public safety is to exercise renewed vigilance, to throw additional guards around the property and person of the citizens and by an example of high public morality and fidelity to duty, to reassure the good and defer the efforts of the vicious.—*Waltham News.*
