DR. BRECKINRIDGE ON THE SUFFRAGE QUESTION.—Rev. Dr. Breckinridge of Kentucky, who has done such valuable service to the Union cause during the war, and has sustained emancipation as a war measure, objects to negro suffrage, as is natural enough in an old and conservative Kentuckian. He said in a recent speech :

That any state, left to itself, will ever bestow suffrage on a mass of slaves of a different race, suddenly set free by a paramount authority, and nearly equal in number to the rest of its inhabitants, is an event that will hardly be witnessed in this world. That in any state where slavery never existed, or where it has long ceased to exist, a white race, both cultivated and predominant, will ever give suffrage of its own accord to a black race, resident with it, equal to itself in number and greatly beneath it in civilization is an event contrary to the common judgment of mankind, and wholly improvable in itself. Nor if the relative position of the parties was exactly reversed would the result be different. Because the instincts of mankind are more permanent by far than the caprices of enthusiasm, and wiser by far than the extreme conclusions of delusive theories or of party spirit. Secured in the great gift of freedom, protected in the rights of person and the rights of property, four millions slaves of a different race will have received—if God continues to smile on our endeavors—an instalment of blessings indefinitely rich. Let these blessings be enjoyed and improved, not wasted and risked in the agitation of demands which have no foundation in reason, in experience, or in public necessity, and which are attended with many perils and no hope of true success.

METALLIC CEILING.—While all other departments in the internal decorations of houses have kept improvements in other branches of industry, it is a somewhat remarkable fact, and one that has engaged the attention of architects, that the ceiling of our rooms, with their unseemly blisters and network of cracks, are still, generally speaking, just what they were many years ago. Mr. Little has invented a system for the construction of ceilings, which consists in the application of the joisting of very thin-stamped ductile metal in ornamental embossed panels, of such sizes and shapes as may be required. These stamped panels are fitted for every kind of decoration in color, and, if inserted as plain surfaces, may be used as the ground for every description of cartoon painting, combining with lightness and durability artistic and ornamental effect, at a comparatively small cost. Besides its applicability to the ceilings of rooms, and all public buildings, churches, etc., the system may be made use of with the same effect in staircases, mills, and porticos, and even on the walls of the rooms.—Ryland's Circular.

A TERRIBLE SUCCESSION OF MISFORTUNES.—The Vancouver Register of December 2d, says : The house of the late Victor Smith, at Port Angeles, was totally destroyed by fire one night last week. The fire occurred so suddenly that Mrs. Smith had barely time to escape in her night clothes. Sad misfortunes have befallen this family within a short time past. Not two years since their old home was swept into the sea by the fierce water-avalanche that broke from the over-hanging mountains, and destroyed everything impeding its resistless course; only a few months since Victor Smith found a watery grave on board of the ill-fated Brother Jonathan, and now the mourning and desolate widow is bereft by another destroying element of all her property and the home that sheltered her and her children.
