TIMELY WARRING -The Mining and Ecientific Press gives its renders some timely warning, adapted to the locality, (San Francisco) in which it is published. It is suggested that, when the next earthquake comes, the people will find it safest not to rush into the streets too suddenly, as there is more danger between two rows of lofty brick buildings than inside houses of a similar character. Persons should aim to get close to partitions or outside walls, and cling to them until the heaviest shocks are over.
