STEAMER MOVEMENTS .- The steamer Pacific was to leave San Francisco for the Columbia River on the 7th inst., and the new steamer Montana was to follow on the 10th. The steamer Lookout is on her way out from New York to take her place in the Oregon trade, and in company with the Montana will constitute an independent line. It is stated that new steamers will take the places of those which have beretofore been employed between Portland and San Francisco.

Only a portion of the mail matter was at that point; the remainder being at The Emporium, else all the detained mail would have been brought up. An attempt to bring the balance will be made during the week.

Tur Washington Standard says that it is superfluous for the Legislature of Washington Territory to grant the right of suffrage to negroes, as Congress has a right to define the qualifications of electors in the territories; and if that body grants new franchises to the colored people, it will be by a general law; if not, it is not desirable that out on this const the people should lead off on this question.
