#### WAR DEPARTMENT HALTS DELIVERY OF HAND BOMBS

Grenades Were to Be Given Away as Souvenirs to Stamp Buyers

Delivery of 15,000,000 hand grenades to the Treasury Department to be converted into savings banks for the stimulation of thrift and sales of War Savings Stamps has been held up by the War Department and contracts which the War Department had with the Treasury Department for supplying the grenades were cancelled, according to a telegram received from Washington by C. A. Farnsworth, associate director of the War Loan Organization in the Twelfth Federal Reserve District. No reason was given for can-cellation of contract beyond the fact that the War Department has "deter-mined that the distribution of hand nades as souvenirs should be dis-

The grenades in question, known as Mills bombs No. 11, were ready for shipment to the American forces in France when the armistice was signed. At the request of the Treasury Department the War Department agreed to turn these banks over to the Treasury Department for conversion into savings banks, and immediately upon as-pouncement that they would be dis-tributed to the purchasers of War Say-Stamps and Treasury Savings tificates, millions of orders flooded in the Twelfth Federal Reserve estrict alone banks and trust com-anies through which the grenades are to be awarded had ordered nearly 109,000 of the souvenirs. 

#### History and Development of Warm Springs Irrigation District

The Warm Springs Irrigation District, organized in 1916, is located in Malheur County, Central Eastern Oregon, and is comprised of 23,600 Artigable acres. It is about 500 miles east of Portland, Oregon, 100 miles east of Pendleton, Oregon, and 60 miles west of Bolse, Idaho. The population of the District is estimated at 4000, which includes that of the cities of Vale and Ontario within and adjacent to the District, though excluded therefrom. Vale is the county seat of Malheur County, and the headquarters of the District are located there. Vale and Ontario, which were incorporated in 1885 and 1895, respectively, EACH have two banks with an aggregate capital of \$335,000 and total resources on January 1, 1819, of \$4,230,950. The 1918 assessed valuation of said two cities is \$1,181,782. Ontario is on the main line of the Oregon Short Line Division of the Union Pacific System from Omaha to Portland, and the entire District is traversed by a 150-mile branch line running from Ontario to Crane in Harney County.

The \$1,350,000 57, bonds have been sold by the above District to enable it to acquire a reservoir site and to construct a dam to impound about \$10,000 acre feet of the flood waters of the Malheur River and also to enlarge and extend the existing canal system.

The construction of the dam six miles from Riverside Station has been completed and it is estimated that the distribution system will be practically complete by December 1, 1918.

The construction of the dam and works has been done by the Shattuck-Edinger Company of Tortland, San Francisco and Los Angeles, and, for speed, the completion of the dam is unparalleled for a similar structure.

The practice of irrigation in this section dates back to the early '80s.

Thus, the susceptibility of the soil to irrigation, its fertility and the productive value of the land are matters of history and not theory or expectancy.

STAPLE CROPS PREDOMINATE, such as wheat, barley and alfalfa a very conservative estimate of average per acre yields for which the soil is capable is 35 bushess of wheat, 55 bushess of barley and 7 tons of alfalfa. It is believed that the average gross value of the crops grown during 1817, 1918 and 1915 on land representing only 40% of the entire District will exceed \$800,000. The winter feeding in the District of large numbers of cattle and sheep contributes materially to the farming revenues which the property owners derive.
