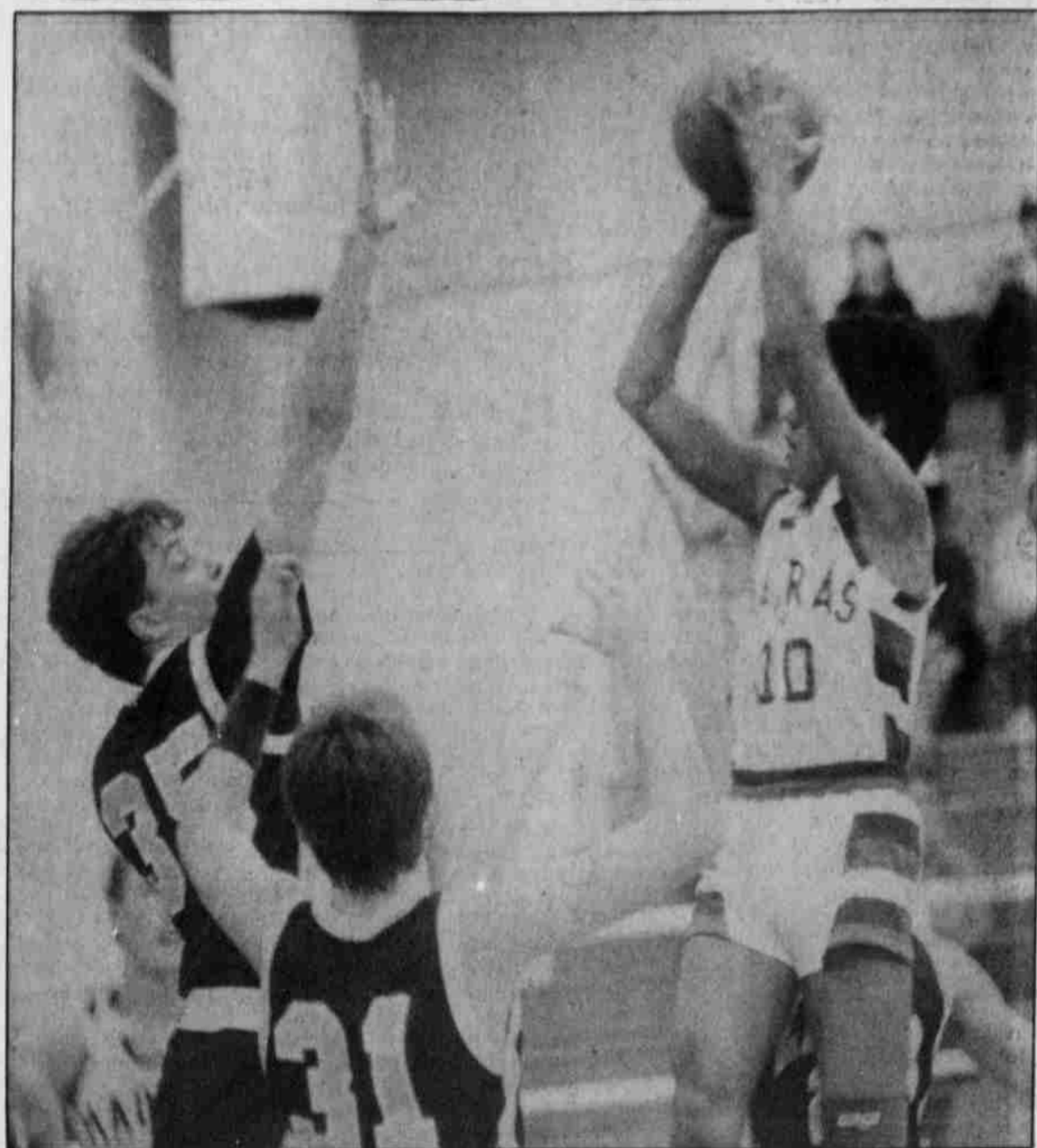

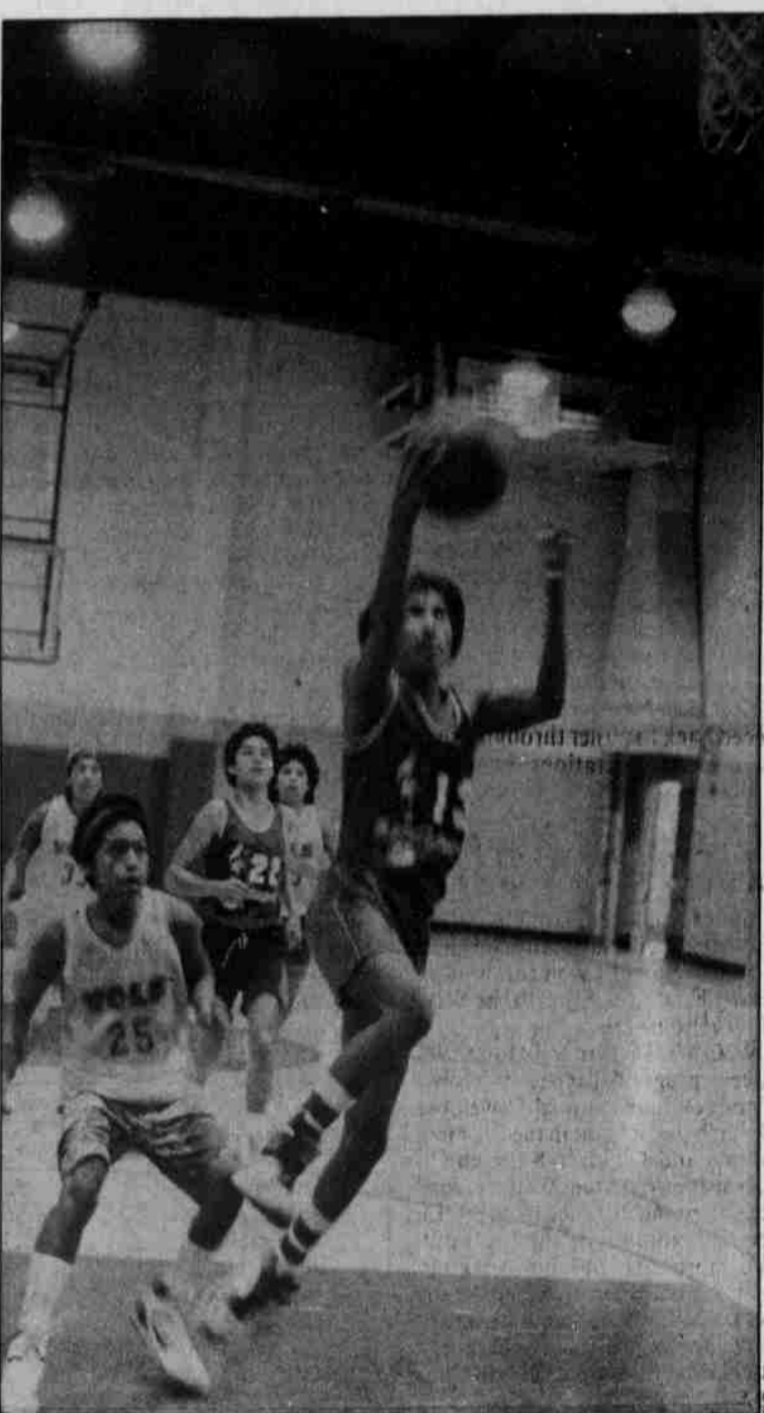

ton and the Crook County Cowboys from Prineville.

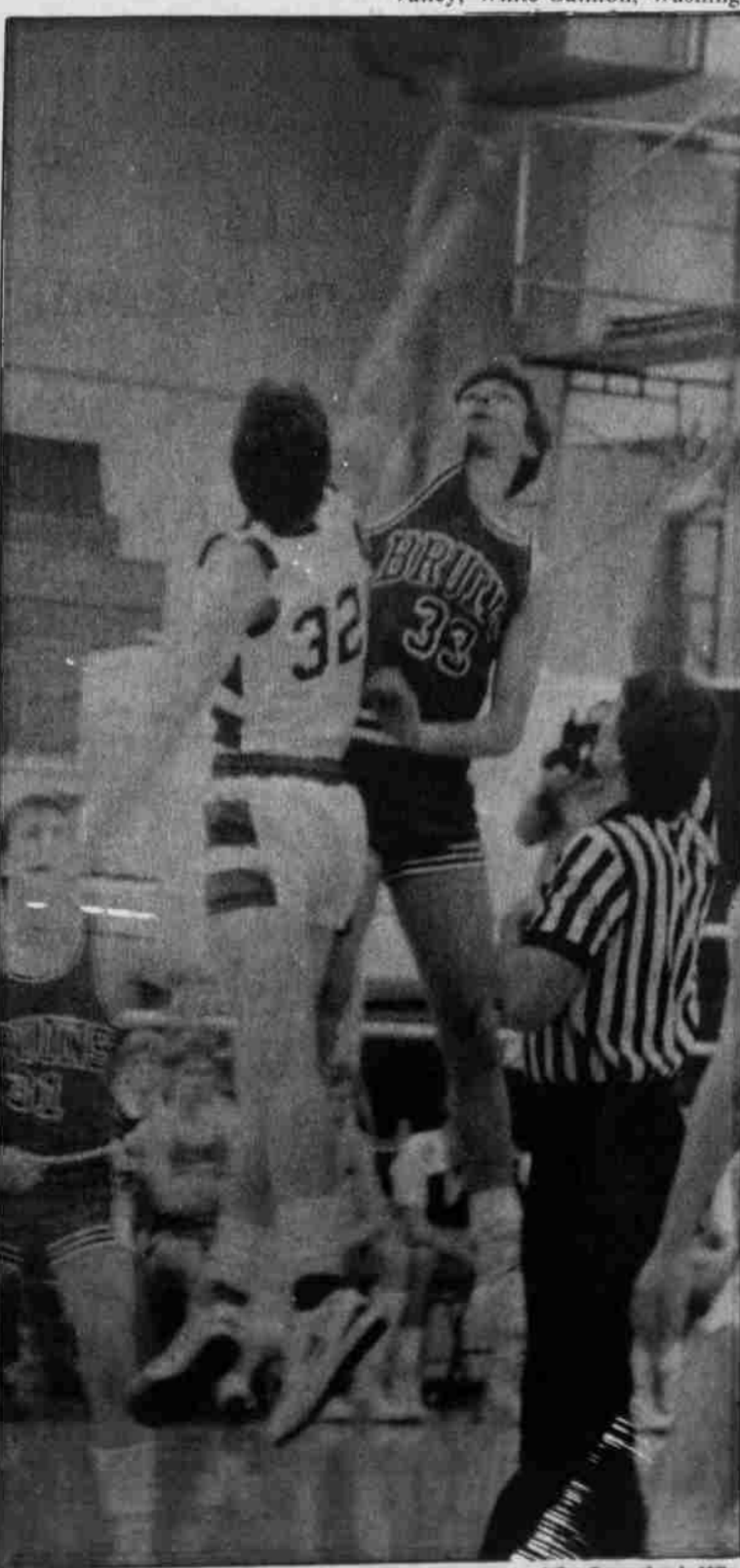

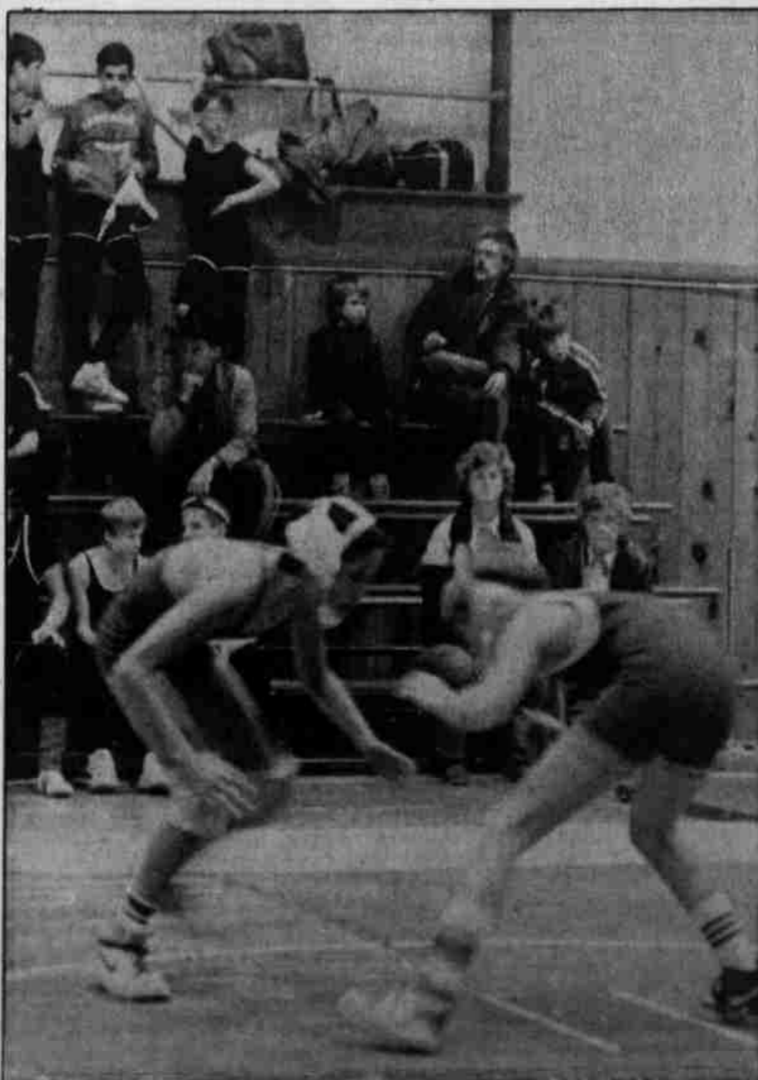
