Cyrus Katchia
1916-2007

Warm Springs and Wasco tribal member Cyrus Katchia passed away on June 23, 2007. He was 90 years young.

Cyrus was born on October 13, 1916 to William Katchia (Own-ups) and Eliza (Manse) Katchia. His grandparents were the late Danial Katchia (Wasco Chief) (Scout) and the late Catharine Katchia (Scout).

Cyrus grew up both here in the Warm Springs community and in Powell Butte. He valued education and graduated in 1935 from Chemawa Indian School in Salem. He passed this value of education to all of his children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

After he graduated Cyrus had many accomplishments throughout his lifetime. He was employed as a boy's advisory counselor for the Warm Springs Boarding School. He lived at the Celilo Falls Village serving as the Constable.

He worked as a road engineer and surveyor for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, in which he retired from.

Cyrus's other accomplishments including serving the Warm Springs community. He was a Tribal Councilman from 1969-1971, and served on both the Land Use Planning Committee and the Water Board.

Cyrus served as a volun-



teer for the Wasco County Museum. He was also a strong supporter of Pi-Ume-Sha Treaty Days.

Cyrus enjoyed many things during his lifetime. He attended and participated in both the Presbyterian Church and the Agency Longhouse. In his early years Cyrus enjoyed being a fisherman near Cascade locks. He was a member of the early bowling league. Cyrus enjoyed watching and playing baseball to the point he became a certified umpire for high school and the American Legion baseball leagues.

Cyrus also enjoyed ranching, in which he raised both cattle and horses in the Tenino Valley. He also loved all of his family very much and enjoyed attending their numerous games, dinners, and other family events.

Cyrus was married twice; to Prosanna Tohet in 1945-1965, and to Shirley Kalama in 1968. Both wives have preceded him in death.

Cyrus is survived by his sons, John S. Katchia Sr., Lyle R. Katchia, and William Katchia all of Warm Springs; daughters, Louise Katchia, and Catherine Katchia; Step-child Tina Kalama

Aguilar, all of Warm Springs. He is also survived by his grandchildren; Damion Katchia, John Katchia Jr., Danni Katchia, James Katchia, Sharon Katchia, Chanelle Jackson, Gary Katchia, Rayann Katchia, Rodney Katchia, Kara Katchia, Alex Katchia all of Warm Springs. He also is survived by his acknowledged sister Gladys Thompson. Cyrus had over 200-plus grandchildren and 30-plus great grandchildren, numerous nieces/nephews all whom he cared for very deeply.

He was preceded in death by both wives; his parents, William and Eliza Katchia; brother, Lyle Katchia; sisters, Agnes Katchia (1906), Winona Katchia-David (1936); Ethel Katchia (1914); Louise Katchia (1936); Margaret Katchia (1914); Admata Katchia (1916) and Caroline Katchia Tohet (1995); his acknowledged sister, Madeline Brunoe McInturff (2006); his son Daniel Katchia (1971); and daughter Sharon Katchia (1966).

The funeral services were held at the Agency longhouse. Sam Starr, Larry Dick and Bill Katchia conducted the dressing. Officiating the overnight services were Longhouse Leaders, Rex Buck Jr., Thomas Morningowl, Rex Robinson and Wiggle Sooksoit. Cyrus was laid to rest on June 27, 2007 at the Warm Springs Agency Cemetery.

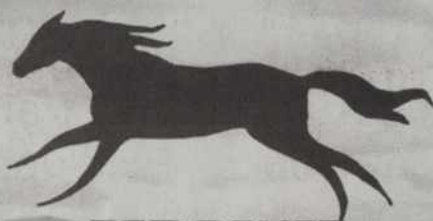
