The Warm Springs tribes and the community of Cascade Locks welcome the Yakama Nation, Nez Perce and Umatilla tribes, as well as other indigenous performers such as the Halau, Chinelos, Aztec and Hawaiian dancers. The dancers will all participate in a celebration of cultural heritage and tradition.

The festival is also a time to learn about salmon restoration and stewardship of the Columbia River.

On Saturday, Sept. 10, there will be the 10k Salmon Run to Eagle Creek, and a one-mile run run/walk on Thunder Island. The run commemorates the return of the fall salmon.
