

LOOK NEARER HOME.

The Portland Telegram, which our esteemed contemporary assures us is independent and its sincerity and accuracy cannot be doubted, contains the following statements of apt and living truth:

"The southern states are cheerfully nullifying the constitution as regards the people's most sacred right—that of suffrage—so that it is manifest that the constitution does not 'follow the flag' even in our own country. Now these people who thus override and nullify the constitution in the south are nearly all democrats, and supporters of our friend, William J. Bryan, who, and whose friends, are vociferously claiming that the constitution should 'follow the flag' into Porto Rico and the Philippines. This makes a mixture that needs unraveling a little to clear up the democratic position. So far as appears the democratic party is in favor of disfranchising and even sometimes shooting niggers, in our southern states, but is morbidly and sensitively solicitous about the constitution and the flag in the Philippines. Perhaps before Mr. Jones and Mr. Bryan, and other leading democrats, make such a far and doleful howl, they had better look nearer home and see how and why the flag and the constitution are operating in our own southern states."

WHY SO SILENT?

The democratic press attempted to make much capital out of the fact that in his speech of acceptance, President McKinley gave no attention to the subject of trusts. Our local contemporary in one of its characteristic effusions, reached this conclusion: "The silence simply means that trusts are for the president and the president is for trusts, and it is pure folly to deny it or attempt to believe anything else." Mr. Bryan delivered his speech of acceptance last Wednesday. It contained 8,000 words, and although we have read it pretty carefully we find no more attention paid to trusts than that accorded them by President McKinley, in fact he didn't give them any attention whatever. Why was Mr. Bryan silent on the trust question? Does his action mean that Mr. Bryan is for trusts and that the trusts are for Mr. Bryan?

North Carolina declared by an overwhelming democratic majority last week in favor of government without the consent of the governed. An amendment to the constitution depriving negroes of the right of suffrage in that state was an issue and gave the democrats a majority of 60,000. The ground swell of Mr. Bryan's protest hasn't reached us yet.

Speaking of prosperity, here is a first-class item: The total exports of American manufactures in the last fiscal year were \$432,284,366, against \$339,675,558 in 1899, an increase in a single year of \$92,608,808. In no previous year has the increase amounted to \$50,000,000.

England is negotiating a war loan of \$50,000,000. Citizens of the United States will purchase \$25,000,000 worth of her bonds. Think of it. A few more years of McKinley and we will be controlling the politics of England. We may decide to annex her as a colony.

Bryan says Charley Towne's withdrawal from the vice-presidential ticket was manly and patriotic. A large majority of Mr. Bryan's fellow citizens would say the same thing of him if he would emulate the example of Mr. Towne.

Democracy used to openly espouse free trade. The Kansas City platform contents itself with condemning the Dingley tariff, and it is pretty meek about that.
