"When the City of Manila was taken, Aug. 13, the Filipinos took no part in the attack, but came following in with a view to looting the city and were only prevented from doing so by our forces preventing them from entering. The balance of the road could be left until a later date, but there is a couple of miles that should be graveled at once."
