England Has no Fear of Inquiry... London, March 17.—In the House of Commons this afternoon Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman the Liberal leader, moved the appointment of a select committee to investigate the whole commercial history of the South African war, including the contracts for the purchase of remounts, meat and forage, and the contracts for freight and transportation, saying that in so doing he was only fulfilling a moral duty and echoing a sentiment deeply felt throughout the country
