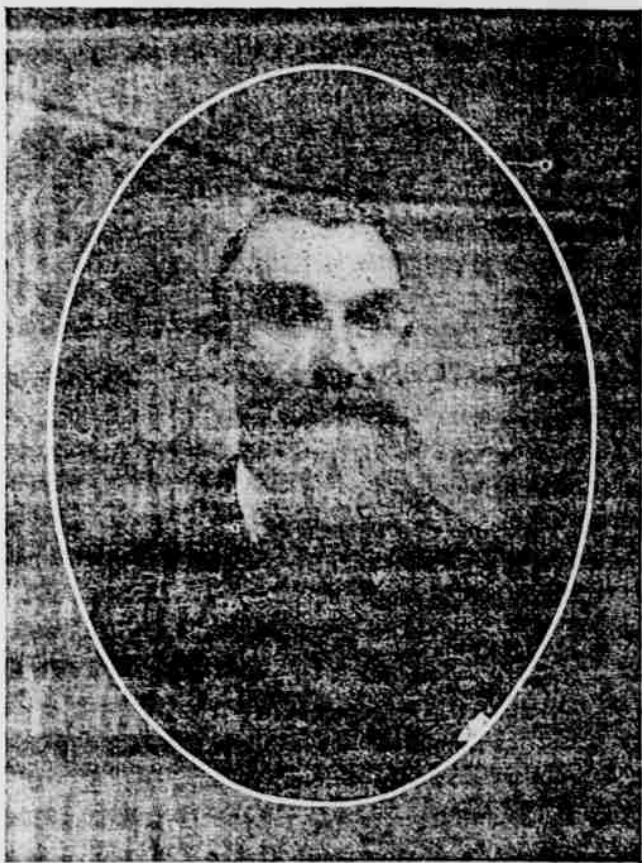

Interesting Case. Canyon City, Or., Oct. 19.—It is expected a case will be filed here in a few days, on appeal from Justice Rea's Court at Monument, which will have no little bearing on the future of the sheep industry in Grant county. In it several citizens allege damage to their pastures along the roadside by the sheep of James Farley, a buyer.

Farley is an outside buyer, who in transferring his sheep to a shipping point is compelled to take them along the highways, where, it is alleged, they did damage by overrunning adjacent fields where there were no fences or only poor ones. Sheep buyers say if they are liable to be held up for a condition thus unavoidable, the trade is as good as stopped already. Farley gave bonds, and promises to resist the claim for damages.
