The Attorney-General says that in view of this plain provision, it would be Impossible for him to hod otherwise than that it is the duty of election judges to reject the bailor of any person who has refused to register his party

The point the Clackamas people tais: is that the requirement of registration is a violation of the secrety of the ballo', for such registration gives notice to the world which party the voter beliangs t . This same question was raised when the primary law was before the people for adoption, and it was then sho n that the primary law violates the scorecy of system of conducting primary elections
