Portland Livestock Market.

Union Stockyards, May 14.—Receipts for the week ending today have been as follows: Cattle 1329, calves 8, hogs 336, sheep 4125 and horses 5.

The cattle market has been strong and while prices have eased off from the high there has been a stiff demand for everything offered and the sellers have had things pretty much their own way. California cattle and California sheep comprise the bulk of receipts in these lines and the quality, of cattle particularly, has warranted high prices.

The sheep market has recovered from the wabby condition that applied two weeks ago. Good quality of sheep have brought fair prices.

The hog market has remained surprisingly strong and high. Steers, \$6 10 to \$6 40; cows, \$3 to \$5 25; hogs, \$10 50 to \$10 65; lambs, \$8; wool sheep, \$6 50; sheep, \$5 25.

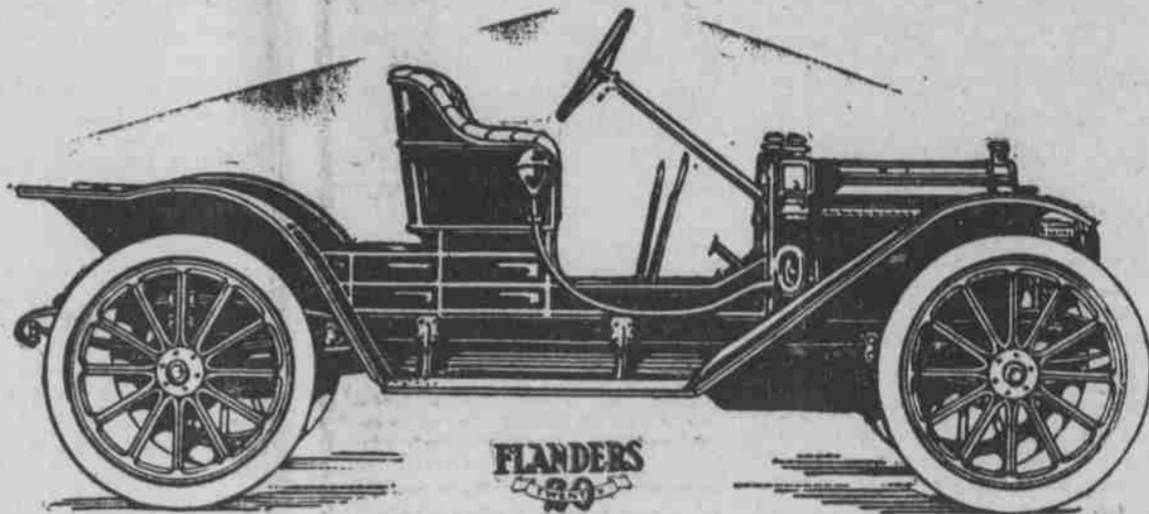
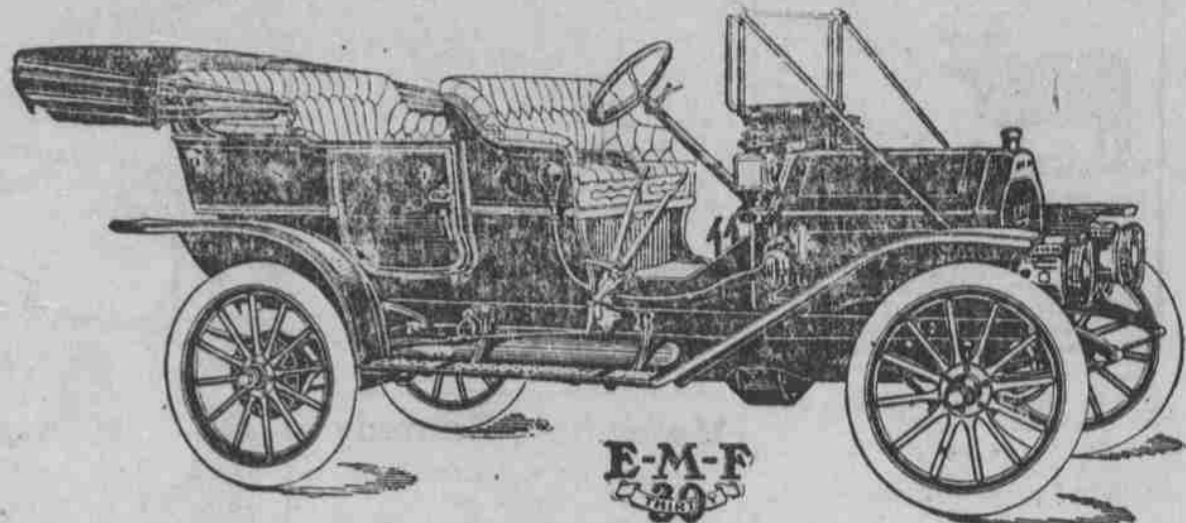

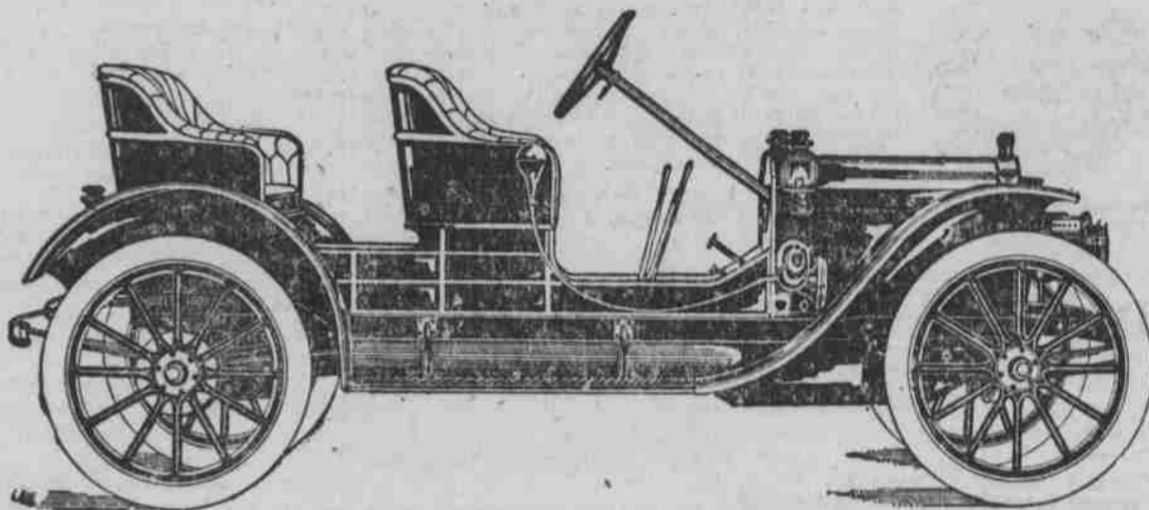
