ELLIS SPEAKS OF CONSERVATION

Theory is All Right but Not Properly Administered.

Pendleton, Or. , July 8 .- That the East is conservational was the statement made this evening by Representaitve Ellis, who has just returned from Washington to spend the Summer at his home in this city.

"I have no fault to find with the conservation theory in itself, if properly administered." said Mr. Ellis. "But if the conservation system is to be administered in such a way that the natural resources of the West are to be bottled up indefinitely, I am not in favor of it at all.

"The bottling up of the timber land would be a mighty profitable thing for the man owning the timber. but it would be disastrous to the state. since it would retard its development indefinitely.

"For that reason I failed to become as enthusiastic concerning the conservation legislation as the members of Congress from the Eastern states. who seem determined to administer the conservation policy according to their own ideas and without regard to the welfare of the Western states. of the interior has restored to the ters will have no trouble in taking trade sources. which are the ones most concerned."
