

RESOLUTION PC 15 02 CUP 01 - PORT FLOAT-ING RESTROOM: A reapplication by the Port of Siuslaw for approval of a Conditional Use Permit to install a floating restroom on Mile 5 of the Siuslaw River approximately 200' south of the navigation channel. The proposed floating restroom will consist of a 12' x 24' barge anchored to two 12-inch diameter pipe pilings installed by a vibratory driver. The proposed barge will be in service from May to October. The floating restroom will be located at the following coordinates: 43.96647°, -124.09653°. The previously proposed site was approximately 800 feet to the west.
