## THE FOREIGN LABOR BILL.

Provisions of the House Bill as Amended and Passed by the Senate.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.-Following is the text of the House "Foreign Contract Labor" bill as amended and passed by the Senate:

Be it enacted, etc.-That from and after the passage of this act it shall be unlawful for any person, company, partnership, or corporation, to in any way assist or encourage the importation or emigration of any alien or aliens, any foreigner or foreigners, into the United States, its territories or the District of Columbia, under contract or agreement, parole or special, express or implied, made previous to the importation or migration of such alien or aliens, foreigner or foreigners, to perform labor or service of any kind in the United States, its territories or the District of Columbia.

Sec. 2. That all contracts or agreements, express or implied, parole or special, which may hereafter be made by and between any person, company, partnership or corporation, and any foreigner or foreigners, alien or aliens, to perform labor or service, or having reference to the performance of labor or service, by any person in the United States, its territories or the District of Columbia, previous to the migration or importation of the person or persons whose labor or service is contracted for into the United States, shall be utterly void and of no effect.

Sec. 3. That for every violation of the provisions of section 1 of this act the person, partnership, company or corporation violating the same by knowingly assisting, encouraging or soliciting migration or importation of any alien or aliens, any foreigner or foreigners, into the United States, its territories or the District of Columbia to perform labor or service of any kind under contract or agreement, express or implied, parole or special, with such alien or aliens, foreigner or foreigners, previous to becoming residents or citizens of the United States, shall forfeit and pay for every such offense \$1000, which may be sued for and recovered by the United States, or by any person who shall first bring action therefor, including any such alien or foreigner who may be a party to any such contract or agreement, as debts of a like amount are now recovered in a circuit court of the United States; and separate suits may be brought for each alien or foreigner being a party to such contract or agreement aforesaid. And it shall be the duty of the district attorney of the proper district to prosecute every such suit at the expense of the United States.

Sec. 4. That the master of any vessel that shall knowingly bring within the United States on any such vessel and land, or permit to be landed, from any foreign port or place, any alien, laborer, mechanic or artisan, who previous to embarkation on such vessel, had entered into contract or agreement, parole or special, express or implied, to perform labor or service in the United States, shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 for each and every alien, laborer, mechanic or artisan so brought, and may also be imprisoned not to exceed six months.

Sec. 5. That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to prevent any citizen or subject of any foreign country, temporarily residing in the United States, either in private or official capacity, from engaging, under contract or otherwise, persons not residents or citizens of the United States to act as private secretaries, servants or domestics for such foreigners temporarily residing in the United States; nor shall this act be so construed as to prevent any person or persons, partnership or corporation from engaging, under contract or agreement, skilled workmen in foreign countries to perform labor in the United States, in or upon any new industry not at present established in the United States; provided that skilled labor for that purpose cannot otherwise be obtained. Nor shall the provisions of this act apply to professional actors, artists, lecturers or singers, nor to persons employed strictly as personal or domestic servants; provided that nothing in this act shall be construed as prohibiting any individual from assisting any member of his family, or any relative or personal friend, to migrate from any foreign country to the United States for the purpose of settlement here.

Section 6 repeals conflicting laws. "Walth."

## WAR NOTES FROM THE SOUDAN.

LONDON, Feb. 18.-The Duke of Cambridge to-day inspected the guards as the latter were leaving for Suakin. The duke in his address to the guards reminded them that their discipline was of a high order, and England would expect a good report of their services in the field. He hoped, notwithstanding the severe trials attending on the campaign in Egypt, the guards would remember their duty to their country and do nobly. The Princess of Wales and her daughters were present at the review. Large crowds of people collected to give the guards a parting cheer.

Reports from Abu Klea, dated the evening of the 15th, state that General Buller announced his intention to evacuate his position near Gabat, and withdraw his whole force to Abu Klea, which is a better strategic position. After rendering Gordon's two steamers useless by removing the machinery, the whole force started on the morning of the 15th just across the desert, and arrived at Abu Klea the next day, without firing a shot. The men are cheerful. They prefer walking to camel riding.

The reason for the abandonment of Gabat was the advance made by El Mahdi with 9,000 men from Omdurman toward Gabat, and a retreat was ordered when the main body of Arabs was thirty miles off, but an advance guard of 3,000 men, with five cannon, was within seven miles of the British lines. General Buller had less than 2,000 men all told.

Great anxiety is felt at the war office about General Buller's force at Gabat. El Mahdi's reinforcements sent to Melannek will increase the force there to 7,500 men. The rebels have ten long range guns. General Buller has no heavy guns at all.

Gladstone, upon the assembling of parliament to-morrow, will speak in defense of the government, and more especially to the Soudan campaign. The powers will sign the Egyptian finance agreement to-morrow. Northcote will demand, in the commons, the immediate production of the agreement.

LONDON, Feb. 18.-A document is published that purports to have been written by an emissary of El Mahdi residing in England. It says in effect that the idea of peace is agreeable to El Mahdi, provided it will be of advantage to Musselmen. El Mahdi considers himself bound to follow in the footsteps of Mahomet, who frequently made treaties of peace with Christians, and other infidels. The document warns England not to compel a general Moslem rising, thus opening the gates to a flood which would overwhelm the human race.

SALEM, Feb. 18.-The board of directors of the Oregon Pioneer Association met here to-day. It was decided to hold the next reunion at Oregon City, June 15th. W. L. White was elected chief marshal, and Geo. H. Williams chaplain. Hon. Geo. H. Williams is to deliver the annual, and E. L. Eastham the occasional address.

There is a gentleman in this city from Newport, who is not interested in the Yaquina bay railroad, who praises the company highly. He says the construction of the railroad has advanced property on the bay one-half, and the people there are very enthusiastic over their prospects. Reports made by malcontents detrimental to the company meet with no approval among the people who the road has benefited. -Statesman.

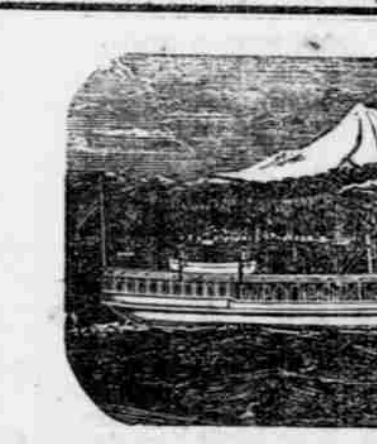
