The bill introduced by senator Mitchell providing for the purchase

and the construction of a wharf in Astoria for the use of the lighthouse department has been reported back by senator Dolph, from the committee on commerce of the senate, with the recommendation that the appropriation for the same

be \$15,000 instead of \$10,000, as originally specified in the bill. The secretary of the treasury has forwarded to the house of representa-tives a recommensation of the lighthouse board that there

lighthouse board that there be included in one of the appropriation bills an appropriation of \$60,000 for the establishment of a lightship, to be provided with fog-signal apparatus and stationed outside of the bar at the mouth of the Columbia river. The board, in their recommendation, reiterated in strong language the arguments that have been used by the government en-gineers and others relative to this


