Since April 1 the jetty at the mouth of the Columbia has been extended 7,250 feet, and before the end of the month 607 feet more will be added. making the total extension for eight months, one mile and a half. The jetty now extends over two and onehalf miles into the ocean, and between fifty and sixty feet is added to its length daily. Between 14,000 and 17,000 tons a month are being dumped into the jetty tramway.
