General Rojas entered the town and established a government, policed the place and everything was peaceful when the ships of the American navy arrived. "We all acknowledge our debt of gratitude to the American people and that to them in the end we will owe our freedom from the Spanish yoke. The fact that General Garcia is cooperating actively proves the faith he has in the American people. This faith is shared by all citizens and we have no doubt that all pledges they have made will be carried into effect. "We wait patiently, assured that when the time comes Cuba will be turned over to us for a peaceful and stable government."

Berlin, Aug. 4.—The funeral services held here today in memory of Prince Bismarck were of the most impressive character.

SPOKANE REPUBLICANS.

Spokane, Aug. 4.—The features of the Spokane county republican convention today were the address by United States Senator Wilson and the withdrawal of Alonzo M. Murphy from the congressional race. Senator Wilson opposed Murphy's claims and the issue was drawn in the election of chairman. The Wilson forces won by a large majority, and Murphy withdrew.
