Land for Canadian Soldiers.

The forest reserves held by the Canadian federal government and all situnted in the West, comprise an area of approximately 27,500,000 acres, and consist of tracts of land unsuitable for agriculture which have been set apart permanently for forest production. At the request of the soldier settlement board areas totalling about 480,000 acres were withdrawn from the reserves in order to be made available for soldler settlement. For the most part these areas consist of small tracts of a few hundred acres, withdrawn from a number of different reserves. Only in the cases of the Riding mountain and Porcupine reserves were the Mrs. Pearl M.
