## Library kick-off draws a crowd

fficials with the Cottage Grove Library reported that 185 children and 130 adults attended the Library's Summer Reading Program kick-off on Wednesday, June 17, where

203 children signed up to participate in summer reading activities. Another 30 signed up the next day. Each student received a free book donated by the Friends of the Library and ice cream donated by Umpqua Bank. They also had the opportunity to meet representatives of the National Guard, Cottage Grove Police and South Lane County Fire and Rescue.

Summer Reading Program activities are planned every Wednesday from 2:30-3:30 p.m. in the Library, and on Wednesday, June 24, Lane County Search and Rescue will attend

Reading with Rover, which offers a chance for kids to read to a canine listener on July 14 and Aug. 11 at 6:30 p.m. The Library also offers Preschool Story Time every Friday morning at 10:30 a.m.

The Summer Reading Program offers kids the chance to track the time they spend reading (or being read to), and a raffle ticket for prizes to be distributed at the program's wrap party on Aug. 19 is earned for every 10 hours of reading.

The Library also wants to issue a reminder that families outside the Cottage Grove city limits are eligible for a free three-month library card courtesy of Friends of the Library, Rotary Club of Cottage Grove and the City of Cottage Grove.



I had the good fortune to meet Don Work who had a popular Saturday Oldies request show on KNND. He asked me to help him pull records for his show.
