

BRICK FACTORY.

The J. R. Cooper Brick Factory to Start up and will Manufacture 300,000 to 400,000 Brick

The manufacture of brick at the J. R. Cooper yard in the southern portion of town will be resumed right away. Mr. Cooper has employed A. M. Gentry as foreman and Mr. Gentry will work twelve to fifteen men during the summer. The starting up of the brick factory will meet a demand that otherwise would have been put to the inconvenience of shipping brick in from the outside. There are hop kilns and hop house flues to build. There are brick to be furnished for the building of the Masonic business structure and there is a brick business block to be built in Monmouth this summer. With a brick yard convenient there is probability of other buildings going up.

The factory starts up with the intention of making at least 300,000 to 400,000 brick.

Reduced Excursion Rates.

Southern Pacific trains connect with the C. & E. at Albany and Corvallis for Yaquina and Newport. Trains on the C. & E. for Detroit will leave Albany at 7 a. m., enabling tourists to the hot springs to reach there the same day.
