## SCHOOLS OF COUNTY AND CITY REOPEN ON MONDAY

### Heavy Enrollment Is Expected--Important Instructions From City Superintendent Imel--List of City and Rural Teachers Selected

The present indications are that the registration of the Grants Pass schools at the opening of the term next Monday will be an increase over the past two years. "Back to the school" should be the motto of every child, for now and now only is the time to get an education.

Everything possible is being done to render the buildings sanitary and the janitors will present clean buildings to the teachers and pupils next Monday.

According to a law passed by the last legislature all children 16 years and under must be in school, and all children between the ages of 14 and 18 who have not finished the 8th grade must be in school. If employed, they must have a child labor certificate and must attend school part of the time. Every effort will be made to see that this law is enforced. Parents, guardians and employers are responsible.

There is a mistaken idea that children cannot enter school except at the beginning. Children may enter at any time except those in the 1B entering school for the first time. The 1B's must enter within the first three weeks or wait until the opening of the next semester. The law requires that children must attend school every day that school is in session. The police will wait upon parents not inclined to observe this law. It is an injustice to the child as well as to the teacher for the child to be kept out of school. The child usually has all he can do to keep up and a few days' absence may result in his failure at the end of the term.

According to the present arrangements, the Fourth Ward school will have only the 1B and 2B classes. Other grades in that district will attend the Riverside school and the Junior High school.

Children should not purchase their books before entering school, as it may be possible to save some classes from purchasing new books the first semester or till they have finished the old books that they now have. Since the exchange price on books is so low, and the price of new books has advanced, every effort will be made to save the patrons additional expense. The above is due to the fact that the textbooks have been changed this year and the new books will be put in, in the main, at the opening of this term. The present plan, however, is to have the 8th grade class at least use its old books.
