

**WANTS FIRE ESCAPES**

The members of the local fire department have at different times called attention to the need of better and more adequate fire protection at the public and high schools in this city and the fire of a week ago emphasizes the importance of this need at this time. I, myself, have often felt that at both buildings there should be some arrangement whereby the children could get out of the building in case the ordinary exits were blocked by fire. I believe that the people of Newberg could not spend their money any better than to install at both schools either suitable fire escapes or chutes so that the children could be rushed out if the fire started in such a place that they could not get out of their regular doors.

Under normal circumstances the children can be put out of either of these buildings in a matter of minutes or more. They are trained so that when the gong sounds they immediately line up and march out. Each grade has its regular place of exit and thus by utilizing all of the various doors, the buildings are emptied very rapidly. However, in case that one or more of these were not available as might be the case if the fire were a big one, the confusion which might result might cause the loss of several or even many little lives.

Other towns, which have failed to take proper precautions of this sort have paid the penalty by losing lit-

tle ones and Newberg ought to prepare for such an emergency now before it is too late. This is especially true of the grammar school because it is a frame structure and also because the children are smaller. However, it is also true of the high school for there the regular exits are not so well arranged. Surely no parent would permit the matter of a few hundred dollars expense stand between this entire school district and so important a thing as the safety of the children.
