

**Program Overview:** The Grant County Library Foundation has been assisting the Grant County Library for over 20 years. By working together, the Foundation and Library have been able to improve library services in Grant County through such activities as the addition of programs and expanding the library collection to name a few. The Foundation is now moving forward with plans to build a new, modern, ADA-accessible library for county residents. Utilizing grants and local donations, the Foundation purchased the Blue Mountain Junior High property to use as a site for a new library. After receiving a \$20,000 grant from the Oregon Community Foundation participating funds, including the Shelk Fund, Ward Family Fund and Jerome S. and Barbara Bischoff Library Subfund, the Library Foundation hired an architect to produce a preliminary design for a new, energy efficient, low maintenance building that will allow for more computers, special collections, and meeting/classroom space. The preliminary design was completed in April and the Foundation is now ready to proceed with a capital campaign to fund the project.
