Special Holy Week services

Some local churches will offer "special services" during Holy Week (April 9-16) other than the regular Palm and Easter Sunday

An example will be the Seder meal offered at Redeemer Lutheran Church on Maundy Thursday at 5 p.m. April 13. Community members will be provided the opportunity to partake in a traditional Passover meal that Jesus would likely have had with his disciples that final week before his dishonorable death on the cross. When asked why this is offered, church elder Buzz Gilmore said, "It's a way to better understand Jesus' Jewishness and to have a clearer picture of how the Lord's Supper came about.'

This Seder meal is very similar to the one in which Jesus partook in and little has changed in the last 2,000 years as the Jewish community has preserved the tradition. The order and text, the Haggadah, was compiled at an earlier time, during the Second Temple Period (520 B.C. to A.D. 70) in Judea. History supports the authenticity of the Haggadah we have today and the assurance that it is very close to what Jesus led at Passover.

Deacon Bill Gurney developed the Haggadah for this Seder to enable Christians to experience a genuine Seder as well as emphasize the unique details that Christians can appreciate and find helpful to
