sewer along the center line of First Street North, from the center line of June Avenue to the center line of Harlem Avenue thence south along the center line of Harlem Avenue to the center line of Caroline Street also along the center line of First Street East from the center line of June Avenue to the center line of Harlem Avenue thence north along the center line of Harlem Avenue to the center line of Caroline Street, according to the plans, profiles, and specifications on file in the office of the City Recorder and there open to the inspection of all persons interested therein. 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Resolution.

It is resolved by the city of Bandon as follows: The Common Council of the City of Bandon deems it expedient and necessary to construct a sewer along the center line of Wall Street from a point where the east line of lot 2 in block 2 Commercial Addition to Bandon intersects with the center line of Wall Street, to the center line of Alabama Avenue, thence along the center line of 2nd Street East, to the center line of Chicago Avenue, and thence northerly along the center line of Chicago Avenue to low water.

That the City Engineer of Bandon has prepared and filed in the office of the City Recorder, maps, profiles, plans, specifications and estimates of the work to be done in the construction of a sewer along the lines above mentioned and the probable cost thereof, together with a statement outlining the district which, in his opinion, will be especially benefited by such sewer and should be assessed with the cost and expense of the construction thereof. That the Common Council finds said plans, profiles, maps, specifications and assessment district satisfactory and hereby approves the same.

That the Common Council does hereby declare its intention to construct said sewer according to the maps, profiles, plans and specifications therefor, and that the estimated cost of which is \$2416.50.

That a sewer be constructed on the streets and between the points hereinbefore designated according to the maps, plans, profiles and specifications therefor on file in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Bandon.

That the assessment district to be benefited by the construction of said sewer and to be assessed therefor shall comprise all of Lots 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10 block 2 Commercial Addition to Bandon.

Lot 10, block 3, Commercial Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, Thrift's Addition to Bandon.

Lots 1, 2, 16, block 3, Woodland Addition to Bandon.

Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, block 5, Woodland Addition to Bandon.

Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, block 2, Woodland Addition to Bandon.

Also, commencing 77 feet S. 36 degrees 50 minutes E. from the intersection of the westerly line of Wall Street and the easterly line of Bandon Ave., thence S. 53 de-
