Roseburg, Or., Nov. 12.—The Douglas county grand jury brought in an indictment against Charles Grider, the roundup promoter who was brought back from Nevada on a bigamy charge.

Sheriff Quine has sent word to the Marshfield officers to try to locate the Ford automobile which Grider had in Coos county last fall. Grider had stripped the machine to the running gears and was using it that way. The machine belonged to a physician in the southern part of the county and Grider failed to bring it back or pay for it. Whether Grider sold it or simply went off and left it some place is not known.
