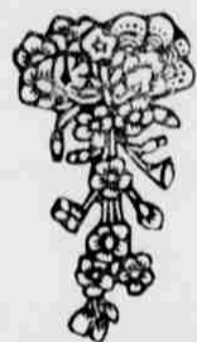

A Big Day On Bandon Beach

Arrangements are now about complete for the celebration of a county Elk's day on the Bandon Beach next Sunday. Bandon is to be the host to all the Elks of the county and the festivities are to take place on the beach. Moving pictures are to be taken of the dominant features and these are to be exhibited through the county and through the state. This film is to be in the neighborhood of 2,000 ft. long and is designed to include many of the important features of Coos and Curry Counties. It will include scenes from the agate carnival at Port Orford; from the logging and lumber mill industries, scenes on the Coquille river and on Coos bay but the principal feature will be the Bandon beach with its picturesque rocks as taken during the Elks gathering next Sunday.

The commercial club made preliminary arrangements for this event at its meeting last Tuesday night and a committee representing the club and city, consisting of J. Sullivan, H. J. McDairmid and W. S. Wells went to Marshfield Wednesday night and attended Elk's lodge there when the arrangements were made with the fraternity in that city.

A special rate has been made from Marshfield of \$1.55 for the round trip and a very large crowd, a special trainload of people is expected from that city.

The party is expected to arrive in Bandon at 10 o'clock in the morning. Bandon Elks will be the entertainers, even to a clam bake which will

feed the visitors at noon. There will be a program of races on the beach and sports in the water. A tub race in the surf and automobile races on the sand. There will be one race of autos going backward.

There will also be a ball game in the afternoon between the Bandon and Marshfield Elks.

To make a film of this and other events such as is contemplated in the 2,000 feet of film will require an expenditure of considerable money, about \$500.
