Canada After Wheat.

Inland Empire Wheat Superior for Malted Breakfast Food.

Inland Empire wheat is rapidly attaining a wider reputation for its excellence as a basis for popular break-

fast food. The latest concern to use wheat from the eastern part of this state in the breakfast food industry is the Brackman & Ker Milling Co. of British Columbia. The firm's headquarters are at Vancouver, but its branches extend throughout the province and the Northwest territories of Canada.

The Brackman Ker company has just completed the erection of an \$18,000 plant to produce a malted wheat breakfast food, for which Eastern Washington white wheat will be used in preference to all other varieties available. The plant has a capacity of 1800 pounds of finished food daily, and is located at Vancouver.

The company has occupied an important place in promoting the growing of high class milling oats in the Vancouver, B. C., district, and Alberta. In past years many scores of cars of select Norwegian and Swedish oats have been imported and distributed as seed on a contract basis, while this year a large quantity of New Zealand oats will be brought in for seed purposes, the special variety in view having taken the premium at the St. Louis exposition for white oats, scaling 46 pounds to the bushel. Black oats grown at Moscow, Idaho, exceeded this weight by half a pound, but the black oat is not as desirable for milling purposes. It is maintained that the oats produced on tidal bottoms along the Fraser river in an excessively humid climate are unequalled in the world for milling purposes.
