

ACCIDENTALLY KILLED.

John Wilkinson Loses His Life at Golconda Sunday.

John Wilkinson, a miner employed at the Golconda, was accidentally killed early Sunday morning while being raised in the cage from the 200 foot level to the surface.

County Coroner Snow, of Baker City, held an inquest at the mine Monday afternoon, and the verdict rendered by the jury was in effect that the deceased came to his death from unknown causes while being raised from the 200 foot level to the surface at the Golconda mine.

The deceased was 32 years old and unmarried. He was a Canadian by birth, but has a brother living at Higbee, Missouri, where the remains were sent yesterday afternoon for burial.
