Hiroshima & Nagasaki remembrance

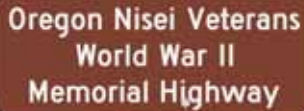

Who is eligible for a second COVID-19 booster dose?

All second booster doses can be received at least four months after receiving the first booster dose.

- ✓ People age 18+ who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine for their primary and booster doses may receive either Pfizer or Moderna as a second booster.
- ✓ People age 50+ may receive either a Pfizer or Moderna booster dose.
- ✓ Immunocompromised people ages 12-17 may receive a Pfizer booster dose.
- ✓ Immunocompromised people age 18+ may receive either a Pfizer or Moderna booster dose.
