# Local youth learn to 'move like a mammoth' at library event

Twenty-four children and numerous adults attended the Ione library's program "Move Like a Mammoth" on June 21.

## DA's Report

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson has released the following report:

-Heather Payne, 40, was convicted of Theft II, a Class A Misdemeanor. Of the sentence of 180 days jail time, 150 days were suspended and the defendant

sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 20 hours of community service. Multiple counts of Abuse of a Memorial to the Dead were dismissed. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$100.

-Heather Payne, 40, additionally was convicted

of Failure to Appear II, a Class A Misdemeanor. Of the sentence of 180 days jail time, 160 days were suspended and the defendant sentenced to 24 months bench probation, to include 20 hours of community service. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$100.

- Heather Payne, 40, additionally was convicted of Theft III, a Class C Misdemeanor. Fines, fees and assessments totaled \$50, with the addition of \$4.37 restitution to Sinclair Gas Station, for a total of \$54.37.
