
Pet of the week

Local leaders share resolutions for 2015

This week, local leaders shared their personal New Year's resolutions. The most common goals centered around fitness and family, but other responses included adopting a different type of diet and even watching football.

Hermiston City Manager Byron Smith said his goals this year are "better eating and more exercise" but also spending more time with his family.

Hermiston School District Superintendent Dr. Fred Maiocco said he is still working on his resolutions from last year: spending more time with his grandchildren and losing 10 pounds. He said he has failed at both of those goals so far but is still working on them.

Hermiston Police Chief Jason Edmiston said he wants to lose some weight, as well, but also plans to "find the time" to begin working on a master's of public administration degree.

Debbie Pedro, CEO of the Hermiston Chamber of Commerce, said she wants to cleate more exciting memories with family and friends."

Umatilla Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Karen Hutchinson-Talaski said her goals don't change from year to

Umatilla City Planner Bill Searles said he hopes to "start saving money instead of spending it all" this year.

"It would be nice to feel like I can be financially comfortable," he said. "It's time to start saving money if I ever want to retire — not that I'm looking at retiring soon, but if I ever want to retire."


