Coming on the tail of moving into its new office space in Hermiston, Pregnancy Care Services of Hermiston and Pendleton recently held a fundraising banquet.

With a theme of Celebrate A Vision for Life, Debbie Cissna, executive director of the Hermiston office, called the Jan. 22 event a success. The goal of \$25,000 was eclipsed — with more than \$45,000 raised by nearly 400 people in attendance. In addition, 38 people started a new monthly partnership or increased their current level of involvement, increasing the organization's monthly funds by almost \$1,500.

A packed house filled the Hermiston Conference Center and those in attendance enjoyed a pork loin dinner prepared by Kathy Barnett. In addition, John Ensor, a leader, speaker and writer for the pregnancy help movement, was the keynote speaker for the event. Esnor's message, Cissna said, was an impactful reminder that "the call to defend pre-born human life is nothing new, it's just our turn.'


WHAT INSPIRED ME TO WRITE MY FIRST BOOK. After my 4th tour in Iraq back in November 2009,

I was having a hard time shutting off the war mindset. While I struggled to keep the inner rage from war under control, I fought three years to get seen by the Mental Health Department from the United States Army . Once I established my first appointment with a Psychologist I wrote a 25 page statement about my side effects from war and gave it to them a week prior to my first appointment. I figure when you spent 6 years running back and forth to Iraq "January 2003 to November 2009" it's hard to explain or share all your problem to a Psychologist who will only give you a 50 minute session. The 25 pages has became a book which is now on a mission to stop the 22 suicided Deaths a day amongst our fellow War Veterans.


