FEDERATED CHURCH SUBMITS ARTICLES

For the guidance of any new comers to Hood River who may be interested in the Baptist denomination, and for the correction of some errors which have been expressed concerning the status of the local Baptist church, the Immanuel church board make the privilege of again presenting their articles of federation. These articles will indicate to any interested party the fact that the Baptist church still exists, and in such form of organic union with Christians of other names as should permit the interest and cooperation of those who are concerned in the progress of the Kingdom of God. They will also indicate to any person living in the vicinity of the Heights church and feeling inclined to worship there, the ground of fellowship which is made possible for members of evangelical churches, the basis being that of equal recognition for all. For some years past, the Heights church, in its peculiar location, has been a congregation of people made up of many different names, and in the constitution herein set forth it has established what it is hoped, may become a satisfactory basis of religious cooperation and prove, at least, one step on the road towards those adjustments in over-church communities for which the Christian world is longing.

Articles of Federation

To consist of the members of the First Baptist church of Hood River, Oregon, and such members of other evangelical bodies as now are associated members and any others who are in sympathy with the purpose and the spirit of the federation.
The entire federation shall be known as the name Immanuel Church Federated. The title to the property shall remain as at present in the hands of the First Baptist church and its trustees. The maintenance of the property, including interest, necessary repairs and improvements, shall be borne by the Immanuel Church Federated, the lessor stipulating with any further explanation of the above shall be on the basis of the Mosier articles of federation.

Its purpose shall be the teaching of the Gospel and plan of ethics as taught by Jesus Christ, the public worship of God, the expression of Christian spirit in the speed of the Gospel among all peoples, and the encouragement of such additional stipulations with any further explanation of the above shall be on the basis of the Mosier articles of federation.

MOUNT HOOD CO. COMPLETES TRESTLE

The Mount Hood Railroad Co. is just completing a trestle, six hundred feet in length, on the extension of the line southwest of Parkdale toward the Lost Lake country, where large tracts of timber are owned by the Oregon Lumber Co. The trestle, which crosses a canyon 22 feet deep, will form a link of the four mile extension that will be finished this summer. A Portland firm of contractors is busy grading two miles of road bed further in the forest.

EDITORIAL PRAISES LOCAL WOMEN

The women of Hood River have proved that a stony group of taxpayers cannot feel certain of keeping back improvements. A proposed bond issue to erect a Carnegie library was voted down at a recent election city, but the Women's club took the matter up and, without serious difficulty, raised the sum required by subscription. Some of the gifts were commendably liberal. It is mentioned, for example, that E. L. Smith's four daughters with some half a dozen others contributed \$800. There is nothing in the way of civic improvement which an energetic and determined woman's club cannot accomplish if it takes hold in the right way. This lesson has been learned in many cities, both large and small, and others are rapidly learning it. Success in practical affairs has given the clubs an appetite to do more of the same kind of work, and we may expect to see them becoming more powerful every day as factors in municipal government, the establishment of park and playground systems, and so on. The old notion that a woman's club was an organization to study art out of cyclopedias and listen to essays on trashy novels has about vanished. The modern woman's club is an extremely practical and keenly active body. It is interested in art and literature, but in a thousand other subjects also. It is particularly interested in politics of the up to date variety. The women probably care as little as they ever did for that kind of politics which is concerned merely with putting one set of rascals out of office and another set in, but this is not the only kind. There is another which seems to apply the principles of justice and common sense to the government of our cities, even to the government of the country. Women are emphatically creatures of common sense in reality they are far less sentimental than men in relation to public business and are less liable to adhere to a political party on purely emotional grounds. At least such is the lesson we learn from their comparatively brief career with the suffrage. The increasing inclination of the women's clubs to enter into politics means an influx of common sense where it is sadly needed.
