The cooperative agency will charge non-residents a tuition fee of \$5, while those residing in the county will only be assessed \$2.50. All students who spend the season working for members of the Association will be refunded the registration fees. The school will be held at the National house.

Daily from 1:30 to 2:30 the inspectors of the Association will be present and will lead free discussions on packing rules. The Association is urging as great attendance of local folk as possible, as a scarcity of packers is indicated this season. Women are especially urged to learn how to pack fruit.
