"It will also be our work to provide tourists with comprehensive and correct maps. We will route the tourist on through our state and Oregon and send him on his way into California. We have a legislative committee that is very active. We figure that this committee in the past two years has saved the surroughlie owners of our saved the automobile owners of our state more than a million dollars in cold cash."
